2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

SCRAP seeks to develop a pilot project to make it easier for local businesses to donate their waste materials for creative reuse. SCRAP will provide education and a process by which Portland businesses and manufacturers can donate waste materials for reuse creatively by the community rather than deposit them into the landfill. SCRAP will provide local businesses with convenient, on-site containers, an educational presentation, pick-up and drop-off service via a biodiesel fueled van.

In April 2006, the City of Portland Council passed Resolution No. 36423 establishing goals for the solid waste and recycling system, including a 75% recycling rate by 2015.

The Department of Environmental Quality offers grants to local jurisdictions to encourage recycling and waste prevention. This grant will allow SCRAP to expand their sustainable practices. This will increase diversion that will positively affect our overall recycling goals.
