1) Legislation Title:

*Accept a US Department of Energy grant of \$276,099 for developing a Local Energy Assurance Plan and agree to the terms of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act for reporting use of funds as outlined in contract documents. (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The two year American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funded planning project will include City bureaus, regional and state governments, and community and industry leaders in the development of the Local Energy Assurance Plan. The initiative will focus on building a regional energy assurance capability to allow cities to better coordinate and communicate statewide and with one another on energy security, reliability and emergency response issues. The objectives of this initiative are to: 1) strengthen and expand local government energy assurance planning and resiliency, 2) reduce the impact from energy supply disruptions and 3) create jobs and save jobs in energy assurance planning at the city level.

The ARRA Grant will pay for 1.5 FTE to coordinate the planning process, conduct research and manage the grant requirements. Costs of personnel, fringe benefits, community outreach and involvement, office set up, and supplies are covered by this grant.

Meetings that will host less than 20 people will be held in POEM office space and not rented from an outside bureau or agency. Supplies used for the project will adhere to city policies for conservation of paper use and equipment.
