1) <u>Legislation Title:</u> *Authorize the Commissioner in Charge of Bureau of Environmental Services or designee to execute agreements for the conveyance of properties under the Bureau of Environmental Services' Grey to Green Land Acquisition and Johnson Creek Willing Seller Programs.

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The purpose of the City's Grey to Green Initiative is to expand the city's green infrastructure to sustainably manage stormwater runoff, stop the spread of invasive plants, restore native vegetation, protect sensitive natural areas, and replace culverts that impede fish passage. Land acquisition supports Grey to Green Initiative objectives by protecting watershed health and water quality, preserving biological communities, expanding and enhancing habitat, and creating additional open space within the City.

The purpose of the Johnson Creek Restoration Plan is to help people move out of harms way of flooding, and acquire land that can be used to restore natural floodplains. Lands acquired under this program will provide the City the opportunity to improve fish and wildlife habitat, restore wetlands, increase natural floodplain functions, and create passive recreational activities for City residents. The City's policy of designating acquired land as open space has allowed the City to achieve a Class 5 ranking within FEMA's Community Rating System. This provides Portland residents who pay flood insurance premiums with a 25% discount. Continuation of this policy, along with other work performed by City staff, may eventually lead to a Class 4 rating and a 30% discount.

Proposed legislation will provide BES with the flexibility it needs to complete acquisitions in a timely and cost effective manner, and provides a process for meeting SAP protocols and accounting procedures.

The Grey to Green Land Acquisition Program has a five-year budget of \$23,000,000 to acquire 419 acres of natural area, with \$3,885,000 allocated for FY 10, \$4,830,000 for FY 11, \$5,190,000 for FY 12, and

\$8,778,500 for FY 13. BES has leveraged \$1,433,500 in Grey to Green acquisition funds to date from PPR, Metro, and Trust for Public Land.

BES estimates a \$2,000,000 budget through FY 13 for acquisition, stabilization, and management of Johnson Creek Willing Seller Program properties through this ordinance.
