7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS</u>:

City of Portland Code 5.33.220.D.10 authorizes the renegotiation of existing contracts with incumbent contractors when it is in the best interests of the City.

Over the past six years, S. Brooks and Associates (Brooks) has provided excellent service under the temporary services Contract #40828 by providing temporary recreation staff such as lifeguards, class instructors, event coordinators, fitness specialists, preschool/childcare instructors, swim instructors, and program specialists.

Brooks is a certified minority owned business that strongly supports diversity in its own workforce, and from the local community. Brooks has proven successful with their strong recruiting strategy within the local community, thereby developing and maintaining a diverse applicant pool.

A discontinuation of the contract with Brooks will result in a considerable disruption to City employees, Brooks' temporary service employees, and the City's customers. Extension of this contract will avert this disruption.

By extending this contract, the knowledge, skills, and training previously learned will be retained. Due to the fact that the temporary employees are involved with health/safety issues, they have a clear understanding of City expectations, safety, procedures, work processes, and are confident in how they are to go about performing the work. This extension will result in a continued high level of customer service.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Costs for this Contract will be funded from the Bureau of Parks and Recreation's adopted budget.
