

ORDINANCE No. 183851

*Authorize grant agreements and Intergovernmental Agreements with fifteen non-profit and public entities related to the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland City Council adopted the Clean River Program on April 6, 1990 which included environmental partnerships, outreach, and education. The Bureau of Environmental Services developed the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (CWSP) to provide grant funds and technical assistance for citizen led watershed projects.
2. In April 2010, CWSP selected the following grants for FY10-11: Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization (IRCO) Gilbert Park Native Garden (\$4,006), Friends of Crystal Springs Restoration (\$3,900), Friends of Tideman Johnson Park Restoration (\$4,800), Lents Springwater Habitat Restoration (\$9,900), Leach Botanical Garden Riparian Restoration (\$5,200), Columbia Slough Watershed Council Eyes on the Slough (\$3,750), Oregon Humane Society Natural Area Restoration (\$5,400), Colonial Heights Presbyterian Church Raingarden (\$4,840), Glenfair Church Community Garden (\$9,995), Friends of Marquam Nature Park Trailhead Improvements (\$4,215), Tabor Commons Stormwater Planter (\$8,294), Laurelhurst School Stormwater Education (\$2,600), Tryon Creek Watershed Council Mentor Project (\$7,300), Vermont Hills United Methodist Church Community Garden (\$4,000), and PCC Sylvania Natural Area Habitat Restoration (\$6,100).
3. The established cost is \$84,300. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 10-11 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWS000007, 529000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:


- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute grant agreements and IGAs for the purpose described in Section 1, in substantially the same forms as Exhibits A and B attached herein, in the amount of \$84,300.
- b. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute amendments to these grant agreements and IGAs that do not increase the grant amount.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay will prevent grantees from beginning summer projects. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
