Project Background

In 2006, City Council adopted the Division Green St / Main St Plan

The plan objectives focused on:

- Community gathering places
- Pedestrian safety and comfort
- Bicycle Movement and Safety
- Bus Stops and Travel Times
- On-Street Parking to Support Businesses
- Neighborhood Livability
- Auto Congestion Management
- Innovative Stormwater Management



Project Background (cont'd)

Issues / Constraints:

- Traffic volumes, speeds
- Presence of pro-time lanes
- Inadequate pedestrian facilities
- Lack of cohesiveness and community identity

Street Classifications:

- Neighborhood Collector Street
- Major Transit Priority Street
- Major Emergency Response Street
- Local Service Bikeway
- City Walkway
- Truck Access Street



Project Approach

- Address the transportationrelated goals and objectives identified in the Division Green Street / Main Street plan
- Address safety, access, and traffic-related issues on Division
- Balance the multi-modal transportation demands and competing uses of the public right-of-way along SE Division Street





Public Outreach Process

- 23-member Citizen Advisory Committee
- 2 Public Open Houses
- Design Workshop
- Business/property owner outreach meetings
- Presentations to business and neighborhood associations
- Attendance at local neighborhood events/festivals
- Project displays/newsletters placed throughout community





Goal 1: Shared Economy

- Street improvements should support both the commercial and residential uses of the street
- Preserve parking where needed for business vitality
- Preserve visibility and sidewalk access to businesses





Goal 2: Clean & Green Environment

- Introduce stormwater facilities, reduce impervious surfaces, and highlight connection to watershed
- Add street trees to maximize canopy
- Design streetscape amenities to support safe and efficient alternative transportation modes



Goal 3: Healthy Community

- Encourage walking and bicycling through improved bike, pedestrian, and transit amenities
- Encourage the community to discover and create community gathering places for all ages




- Increase safety and visibility of schools in the area
- Support traffic speeds that are consistent with high levels of pedestrian activities



Goal 4: Place Making

- Design street improvements that enable and encourage flexible use of public space by local artists and businesses
- Incorporate functional art into the street's design and redevelopment
- Incorporate historical markers or other features that commemorate history of the area





Transportation Analysis

Objectives:

- Determine where the existing crosssection on SE Division Street could be narrowed to two travel lanes (i.e. removal of pro-time lanes)
- Maintain adequate vehicle and truck access to local businesses
- Improve pedestrian, bicycle, and transit access
- Recommend solutions that support project goals and satisfy City and Federal performance standards



Transportation Analysis

Findings and Recommendations:

- SE Division Street can adequately serve traffic with one lane in each direction except at major nodes:
 - SE 11th/12th Couplet
 - Seven Corners Intersection
- For these major nodes, maintain a 4-lane cross-section to provide capacity and address the traffic demands during peak travel times
- Remove pro-time lanes outside of the major nodes to help with vehicle and transit operations (i.e. wider, single travel lane) and to provide space for other streetscape improvements



Streetscape Plan

Plan Highlights:

Pedestrian Safety Improvements

- Curb extensions
- Marked crosswalks
- ADA curb ramps
- Pedestrian count down timers at all existing signals

Green Infrastructure

- Street trees
- Bioswales
- Stormwater planters

Transit Improvements

- Improved stop spacing
- Curb extensions and crossing improvements
- New bus zones / pull outs



Streetscape Design (cont'd)

Plan Highlights:

Bicycle Amenities

- Bike boxes on SE Ladd and 21st
- Bike corrals
- Improved travel across Division with curb extensions and marked crossings

Public Art

Through the Regional Arts and Culture Council (RACC), SE Division Street will receive public art that is:

- Pedestrian-scaled
- Episodic in nature and placed throughout the corridor
- Conveys the character of the community







Streetscape Design (cont'd)

Plan Highlights:

On Street Parking

 Add full time on-street parking in commercial zones throughout the corridor

Paving of Frontage Zone

 Identify opportunities in commercial areas, to maximize space for pedestrians

Street Lighting (TBD)

 Corridor lighting analysis will be performed during the engineering phase

Streetscape Design (cont'd)

Additional Elements Considered

Street Furniture

 Due to the City's maintenance funding constraints, the plan does not include street furniture (benches, trash cans, etc.)

Build-Out of Seven Corners

 Due to complexity of traffic operations at this intersection, the project is unable to narrow this area to a two-lane cross section and build improvements

Future 2-lane Build Out Wide Sidewalk • Moves curbs out 6' along Division from existing locations to create wider sidewalk environment • Incoprorates improvements potentially built in the 4-lane design



Next Steps:

2010-11:

- Proceed with preliminary and final engineering phase
- Work with members of the Division CAC and business/property owners on plan refinements
- Coordinate construction work with the community, business/property owners and public agencies

2011-2013

 Construct streetscape improvements and pavement restoration work from SE 10th to 39th

Expected construction duration approximately 18 to 24 months
