Employees requesting additional reimbursement will turn in worn out safety shoes and proof of purchase of new shoes as a condition of replacement.

# 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Employees in the Water Meter Reader I and II classifications at the Water Bureau work in a variety of conditions and terrain, including opening manhole gates.
