#### 1) Legislation Title:

Amend and extend term of limited right-of-way use agreement granted to Verizon Wireless (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 180379)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation: Amend and extend the agreement to refine terms and conditions for placing wireless facilities on utility poles in the streets - especially sensitive residential areas - and update the compensation section.

### 3) Revenue:

Will this legislation generate or reduce current or future revenue coming to the City? If so, by how much? If new revenue is generated please identify the source. After this amendment becomes effective, the annual fee for facilities on poles in the streets will rise from \$3,500 to \$5,000. Verizon has 4 sites in the streets, so revenue will be about \$20,000 per year. Verizon will also submit \$2,000 to OCCFM each time it requests new facilities on poles in residential areas.

Verizon Wireless (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 180379)

Requested Placement Date: Consent Agenda on July 14, 2010.

- I. RECOMMENDATION. Amend and extend the term of the wireless right-of-way agreement through June 30, 2014.
- II. BACKGROUND. Over the last four years the City Council has granted several wireless right-of-way agreements. The general approach was been to have these agreements expire in 2009 to allow the City to develop consistently applicable terms and conditions. City staff has now reviewed all of these wireless right-of-way agreements, and worked with citizens (see Section VII below), the wireless industry, and the utility pole owners, in an effort to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of all wireless right-of-way agreements.
- FINANCIAL IMPACT. The city will continue to receive franchise fees from this wireless carrier's use of the streets. There will be an increase to \$5,000 per year per wireless site in the right-of-way. As Verizon currently uses 4 poles, its fees will increase to \$20,000 per year. In addition, when carriers use poles in residential areas they will now need to provide a one-time fee to OCCFM in the sum of \$2000 to cover increased staff costs.
- IV. LEGAL ISSUES. None.

- V. CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES. The amendments address the need to provide a better balance between the need for maintaining the character of residential neighborhoods against the need to increase antennae in those areas to increase the provision of wireless services. Compensation for street use is being raised, but industry has been consulted and a special meeting held with them to discuss it. Because wireless is a rapidly growing area the extension is for another four years, after which another evaluation of terms, including compensation, can occur.

- VII. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION. These amendments incorporate input from 2006 to present from the Bureaus of Development Services, Planning, and Parks, and the Bureau of Transportation. In addition, staff has met repeatedly with utility pole owners and wireless carriers. Finally, staff conducted three public meetings in March 2008, followed by an online survey sent to over 17,000 people. There were over 900 quantitative responses and over 350 written comments to the survey. Staff analyzed this input, refined the amendments, and conducted additional public meetings in 2008 and 2009. Staff took additional input during and after these meetings and finalized the proposed amendments.
