If emergency, why does this need to take effect immediately: Grant applications are due to the Department of Housing and Urban Development on August 23, 2010.

4. History of Agenda Item/Background: In June 2010, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development announced funding availability for the Community Challenge Planning Grant program to foster reform and reduce barriers to achieving affordable, economically vital, and sustainable communities. Activities eligible for funding include the development of strategies that promote or preserve affordable housing in mixed-use, mixed-income neighborhoods along existing transit corridors.

If funded, the project will identify existing and projected affordable housing needs in Portland's three existing light rail transit corridors, including identification of existing household types with housing and transportation cost burdens; households at risk of displacement resulting from rising prices; new housing needed to support growth; and alternative strategies to address these needs.

- 5. Purpose of Agenda Item: Authorize the submittal of a grant application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the Community Challenge Planning Grant program.
- 6. Legal Issues: No legal issues have been identified.
- 7. What individuals or groups are or would be opposed to this resolution? No opposition to this resolution has been identified.
- 8. How Does This Relate to Current City Policies? The grant application would be supportive of City and Regional efforts to support transitoriented, affordable, mixed-use, mixed-income and sustainable housing within the City. This project will support refinement of housing policies within Portland's Comprehensive Plan to increase affordability.

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- 9. Community Participation: If funded, the project will provide background information for the update of Portland's Comprehensive Plan. Public discussion and review of this information would occur as part of the Comprehensive Plan process.
