ORDINANCE No. 184097

*Authorize applications to the Oregon Department of Transportation's Transportation Enhancement Program for the Safe Routes to Powellhurst –Gilbert Neighborhood Schools and Clinton to the River projects. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Through its "Transportation Enhancement" grants program, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) is soliciting projects from agencies statewide to be implemented in 2013 and 2014. Eligible projects include "Provision of facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists," and "Provision of safety and educational activities for pedestrians and bicyclists" among others.
- 2. The Vision for the Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) calls for a balanced, multi-modal transportation system where residents will have a broad range of safe and convenient transportation options and will frequently walk, bicycle, carpool, or ride public transit as their first choice of transportation.
- 3. Constructing missing bicycle and pedestrian facilities and educating people to walk and bicycle safely in high-conflict corridors are key City transportation priorities that will improve safety for pedestrians, bicyclists and motorists.
- 4. Removing conflicts between motorists and pedestrians and cyclists is an important component of a safe transportation system.
- 5. Providing the community with safe and reliable transportation options that reduce transportation costs is essential to our community in a time when transportation and housing costs are exceeding 50 % of household incomes.
- 6. PBOT and the Portland Development Commission (PDC) have identified two bicycle pedestrian and safe routes to school projects that are transportation investment priorities and fit the Transportation Enhancement grant criteria and are seeking Council authorization to apply for grants.
- 7. A minimum local match of 10.27% is required. The two PDOT grant proposals include minimum match amounts from a variety of sources. The Safe Routes project is proposing House Bill 2001 as the local match. The Clinton to the River project is proposing using a BES grant and donated right of way as match.
- 8. The applicants' level of confidence in the cost estimates for these projects is high.

9. If one or more grants are approved by ODOT, each award, with budgetary and work program implications, will be submitted to the City Council for the Council's final approval and acceptance.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge and Auditor are authorized to submit applications to the Oregon Department of Transportation for two grants.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurance as are required for the grant application period.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the grant application is due September 31; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
