BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance is presented and requested as an Emergency Ordinance so as to maximize the grant period of performance.

Fiscal year 2011 financial and technical assistance is provided through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG). These funds are provided for the development of an all hazard emergency management capability to promote preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery.

The EMPG FY 2011 Certificate states that the State Office of Emergency Management and the City of Portland Office of Emergency Management will agree to cooperate in the implementation and maintenance of an emergency management work plan.

All funds received through the EMPG program will be provided on a reimbursable basis and will be matched 100% by City of Portland general funds.

Grant funds are budgeted for one half of the cost of two management positions, one half of the annual rent for Portland OEM office space and one half of the total cost of program supplies for training and exercise activities and community alert and notification website management..

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The City of Portland administers this grant. The actual cost for services and personnel would be \$381,724 but with the grant the actual impact would be \$190,862.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Authorize, by signature, the Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Oregon Office of Emergency Management to accept the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) in the amount of \$190,862 to administer an integrated all hazard emergency management program for the City.
