#### 1) Legislation Title:

\* Amend subrecipient contract with Housing Authority of Portland to add \$22,600 to administer additional short-term rent assistance for homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing. (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 32000138)

#### 2) Legislation:

Beginning in FY 2009-10, PHB developed Contact No. 32000138 with the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) to administer the Short-Term Rent Assistance (STRA) program, which was subsequently amended through Council authorization to include additional federal funding and to extend the effective date and duration of the contract to June 30, 2011. The program provides homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing activities, primarily rent and housing placement assistance.

This proposed amendment (Amendment 2) adds to the contract \$22,600 in additional Federal Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Rehousing Program (HPRP) administrative funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) previously allocated to PHB's FY 2009-10 budget for this program.

Beginning in FY 2009-10, PHB developed Contact No. 32000138 with the Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) to administer the Short-Term Rent Assistance (STRA) program. The program provides homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing activities, primarily rent and housing placement assistance. In FY 2009-2010, the City accepted a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the amount of \$4,172,282 for the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The City obligated the majority of HPRP funds to the STRA program and extended the effective date and duration of the contract to June 30, 2011, through Amendment 1 to the subrecipient contract. The City added additional FY 2010-11 funding through Amendment 2.

The current proposed amendment (Amendment 3) adds FY 2009-10 allocations of federal HPRP/ARRA dollars that were previously retained and unspent by PHB. These admin dollars will

cover the additional administrative expenses that HAP incurred as a result of increased regulatory complexity and the doubling of the STRA program capacity associated with HPRP/ARRA funds.

Nothing should be controversial. This is a straightforward assignment of administrative funds from Federal grant sources to cover actual administrative costs at HAP. PHB had initially retained these funds anticipating increased administrative expenses at PHB, but PHB did not incur as much administrative expense as anticipated. Conversely, HAP's administrative costs associated with HPRP/ARRA were higher than initially anticipated. Movement of these funds will allow for timely and appropriate spend-out.

  - This proposed amendment (Amendment 3) adds to the contract additional Federal HPRP/ARRA administrative funds (\$22,600) previously allocated to PHB's FY 2009-10 budget.
  - These funds will cover actual administrative costs incurred by HAP to administer the short-term expansion in complexity and scope of the STRA program as a result of inclusion of HPRP/ARRA funds in STRA.
