7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Portland Water Bureau entered into a contract with Analytical Services, Inc. (ASI) to work with City staff to design a sampling plan and perform the associated sample analysis in order to obtain a variance to the treatment requirements of the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2).

The Water Bureau completed the sample analysis and study and is preparing to submit a variance request. It is anticipated that this variance process could last as long as a year or more, during which time the Water Bureau intends to continue monitoring source water to meet what the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has outlined as the likely minimum conditions of a variance. As the contract amount was originally intended for the year-long sampling plan process, more funding is required to continue the monitoring program and carry out the same type of laboratory analysis that has been performed on source water and scat samples during the sampling plan.

As part of the year-long LT2 variance sampling program, a sampling method modification was researched to improve the effectiveness of analyses. The method modification has undergone a Tier 1 validation specifically for Portland's source water. As this validation is laboratory specific, it is important that the Water Bureau continues to work with ASI to avoid another lab needing to seek validation for the method modification. Funds in the current ASI contract are not sufficient to continue sampling beyond March 2011 and will result in a significant interruption in the Water Bureau's LT2 interim sampling.

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The contract will be amended to increase the budget by \$800,000. The new contract total will be \$1,625,000. Funding will be requested in the Spring BuMP.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:

Amend contract 30000364 with Analytical Services, Inc. to increase compensation for laboratory services for Cryptosporidium Analysis.
