1) Legislation Title:

* Authorize application to U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Program, Bureau of Justice Assistance for a grant in the amount of \$199,883 for the FY 2011 Intellectual Property Crime Enforcement Program (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

The City of Portland, Oregon Police Bureau wishes to apply for U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) grant funding. The Detective Division's White Collar Crime Detail will create an Intellectual Property Crime Enforcement Team (IPCET), which will include a 0.5 FTE Deputy District Attorney Level III. The grant period is October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012.

3) Revenue:

Will this legislation generate or reduce current or future revenue coming to the City? If so, by how much? If new revenue is generated please identify the source.

The USDOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$199,883 for expenses incurred by the bureau for IPCET personnel overtime hours, training, travel, program supplies. An intergovernmental agreement with Multnomah County will provide for the personnel expenses for a 0.5 FTE Deputy District Attorney.

What are the costs to the City as a result of this legislation? What is the source of funding for the expense? The City will incur benefit expenses (Medicare) not eligible for federal reimbursement. The expense, approximately \$1,210, will be provided by funds from FY 2011/12 and FY 2012/13 Police Bureau program budget appropriations within the Detective Division. No match is required for the grant.
