## 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

#### Include:

**-history of project** – The Department of Homeland Security (DHS), through its Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), has offered the Assistance to Firefighters Fire Grant Program since 2001. The grant funds a variety of programs, including those to enhance emergency operations, firefighter safety, and prevention efforts.

DHS has notified PF&R that it will be awarded \$720,000, with a local match requirement of \$180,000. The actual cost of the aerial fire truck will be approximately \$1.25 million. The match portion and the additional cost of the apparatus will be funded by the G.O. Bond passed in November 2010.
