In 1999, the information Technology Executive Committee (ITEC) determined the Environmental Systems Research Institute Inc. (ESRI) software product to be the right software system for the City's enterprise geographic information systems (GIS). Council approved, via Ordinance No. 173164, to move to a standard GIS environment and authorized Contract No. C32266 with ESRI to provide an enterprise GIS software license agreement.

In 2006, it was determined that it would be extremely cost prohibitive to migrate to an alternate software solution given the usage and extent of reliance on the ESRI software throughout the City. As a result, the Bureau of Technology Services (BTS) obtained Council approval via Ordinance No. 179884, to execute Contract No.C40983 for an initial three year period to provide an enterprise license agreement for cost effective licensing of the ESRI products.

In April 2009, Ordinance No. 182739 authorized an amendment to City Contract No. C40983 for an additional three years, from July 1, 2008 to June 30, 2011 at a cost of \$727,000. Amendment No. 1 also allowed for up to four additional one year options, taken in single or multiple year increments.
