As a result of this project Water Bureau properties located throughout the City will be maintained to promote community safety, visibly attractive and accessible to the public and Water Bureau employees. Additionally through this contract, at-risk youth, under the supervision of Multnomah County's Department of Community Justice, will be able to gain on-the-job training, skills acquisition, work experience and develop good work habits, while earning money to pay back victims of crime.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The Multnomah County Department of Community Justice and the Portland Water Bureau have been involved collaboratively in this effort. This contract represents well over a decade of work between these two municipal organizations.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

This work has been a valuable asset to the community, probation and parole staff, crime victim advocacy groups, and crime victims. Historical outreach efforts to these groups and individuals have resulted in programs such as this to assist in building a sense of closure for crime victims, through payment of court-ordered restitution.

The work with Department of Community Justice program staff was implemented through the Bureau's Business Operations Group.
