The JWC is a primary drinking water supplier in Washington County, Oregon. The JWC is managed by the City of Hillsboro. The Joint Water Commission provides potable water to over 400,000 people through its member agencies and wholesale customers. The JWC has a water treatment plant (WTP) on the Tualatin River capable of producing up to 75 million gallons per day. In 2009, Black & Veatch completed a capital improvement master plan for the WTP.
