### I. RECOMMENDATION

The Office of Cable Communications and Franchise Management recommends that Council approve the PSU temporary revocable permit for a period of 30 months for PSU's temporary pilot program to install electric car charging stations.

### II. BACKGROUND

Portland State University (PSU) is partnering with Portland General Electric and the City of Portland to create a temporary pilot and research program on a one block area on SW Montgomery between SW Broadway and SW Sixth, called "Electric Avenue." PSU is seeking a temporary revocable permit to construct and operate an electric car charging stations (electric vehicle supply equipment services). Electric Avenue will showcase a variety of electric vehicle supply equipment services from multiple vendors, and PSU will gather information during the 30 month period on the public's use of electric vehicles. At the end of the pilot program, the equipment will be returned to the various participating vendors.

The pilot project is not designed to generate revenue for PSU. As part of the demonstration, visitors who use the charging stations to power their electric vehicles will pay only standard parking rates with no premium for electricity.
