* Authorize application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance for a grant in the amount of \$50,000 for the FY 2011 Gang Resistance Education and Training Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) invited the City of Portland to submit a new funding request for the FY 2011 Gang Resistance Education and Training (G.R.E.A.T.) Grant Program; and
- 2. The City of Portland, Oregon Police Bureau applied for \$50,000 in grant funding on July 27, 2011, which will aid in the delivery of the Elementary and Middle School curricula as well as the G.R.E.A.T. Families and Summer Components; and
- 3. The USDOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$50,000 to fund program expenses, including overtime for sworn personnel instruction, travel and program supplies for 12 months; and
- 4. The grant requires a 10 percent local match, which will consist of Salary and Fringe Benefit expenses for 2.0 FTE program personnel currently assigned to the G.R.E.A.T. Local program; and
- 5. The grant period is October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to make application to USDOJ OJP BJA for a grant in the amount of \$50,000 in a form substantially in accordance with the application attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Mayor is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The OMF Grants Office is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with this application may result in not receiving funding. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
