7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Include:

-history of project - The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has offered the Assistance to Firefighters "Fire Grant" Program since 2001. Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) has applied for this grant annually since 2002, with frequent success. The grant funds two programs: Firefighter Operations and Safety, and Firefighter Vehicle Acquisition. PF&R has developed a grant proposal for the "Firefighter Operations and Safety - Personal Protective Equipment" portion. DHS requires local matching funds for this grant. PF&R is requesting funds to purchase individual facepieces for firefighter's self-contained breathing apparatus The total budget of the grant is \$648,000. If approved, DHS will fund approximately \$518,400, and the City would be required to match approximately \$129,600. The City of Portland Grants and Contracts Office is aware of, and assisting with, this grant application.
