7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In 2007, Mary Leverette was hired in a limited duration position as a Senior Conservation Program Coordinator for the Office of Sustainable Development which eventually became a permanent position with the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability.

In October 2009, Ms. Leverette's job responsibilities and the location of her work were changed due to concerns about the way she interacted with staff that she supervised. Although her job classification and salary remained the same, Ms. Leverette perceived this reassignment to be a demotion. Approximately one month after her reassignment, Ms. Leverette went on extended medical leave. She was placed in medical lay-off status effective April 29, 2010.

Ms. Leverette filed a lawsuit against the City claiming that she was a victim of age discrimination. Although the we do not admit that Ms. Leverette was unlawfully discriminated against, the City Attorney's office and Risk Management recommend paying \$28,000 inclusive of all damages and attorney's fees in exchange for her dismissal of the lawsuit and settlement agreement.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$28,000 in wages, with all withholdings and deductions.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Mary Leverette wage loss lawsuit in the sum of \$28,000 minus withholdings and deductions.
