Council authorized an Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Oregon Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for an Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) under ordinance 184305 on December 16, 2010.								
The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) was awarded a grant from the FY 2011 EMPG program in the amount of \$160,000. These funds are provided for the development of an all hazard emergency management capability to promote preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery.								
OEM and the PBEM will cooperate in the implementation and maintenance of an emergency management program that addresses the potential hazards to the jurisdiction in accordance with the funding requirements of the EMPG program. Duties of OEM are to review and approve Work Plan action items, review and approve quarterly reports, convene the EMPG Workshop and reimburse PBEM for costs incurred, related to the 2011 Work Plan. Duties of PBEM are to implement actions listed in the 2011 Work Plan and report quarterly to OEM regarding accomplishments of the action-items.
