The contract amount is not to exceed \$420,000 over five years. This includes \$200,000 to migrate the database and \$220,000 for database enhancements and annual maintenance and support over five years. The source of funds is the dedicated FPDR tax levy.

The FPDR Board of Trustees and the City Council approved \$240,000 for this project during the FY 2011-12 budget process. FPDR's five-year forecast includes \$50,000 per year] for additional enhancements and ongoing maintenance and support; these funds will be approved each year as part of the annual budget process. In both cases, the expenses included in this contract are less than the approved and/or projected expenses.

The FPDR Board of Trustees elected to pursue replacement of the database, determined the scope of the project, and authorized the contract now before City Council. The Board includes two citizen members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by City Council, and two members elected by active police officers and fire fighters. In addition, FPDR members and other citizens had the opportunity to testify about this project at several Board meetings. Finally, the selection committee that reviewed and recommended bids for this project included a minority representative.

Public involvement influenced the FPDR Board's decision to pursue the lowest cost, lowest risk alternative for replacement of the existing database.

I. RECOMMENDATION

It is requested that the ordinance to authorize the contract with OBS be placed on the Consent agenda and approved by Council.

II. BACKGROUND

In 2002, the Fire and Police Disability and Retirement Fund (FPDR) entered into an agreement with Data Management Consultants (DMC) to provide computer systems design, maintenance and programming services. DMC's contract will be expiring on December 31, 2012. The FPDR database uses an outdated technology platform that will not be supported by the vendor in the near future. FPDR determined that migrating the database to a new platform was the low-cost, low-risk solution, and the FPDR Board of Trustees authorized a budget of \$240,000 for the project in FY 2011-2012. Therefore, in July 2011, FPDR began a bid process through the City's Request for Proposal procedures for an independent technology vendor. Four vendors submitted proposals. The proposals were reviewed by the Selection Committee, which consisted of individuals from FPDR staff, BTS, as well a non-City individual.



III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The OBS contract is for a five-year period from November 1, 2011 through November 1, 2016. Compensation will be as follows:

- System development in an amount not to exceed \$200,000;
- Ongoing maintenance and support in an amount not to exceed \$120,000;
- Enhancement projects in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.

There are funds available in the FPDR's current year budget.
