- I. RECOMMENDATION. Extend the term of Qwest Corporation's franchise to December 31, 2012.
- II. BACKGROUND. From 2001-early 2009 Qwest and the City have been in litigation regarding the legality of the City Charter, City Code, right-of-way management, and compensation required for private use of the public streets. The litigation has concluded in the City's favor. Several sections of the current franchises relate directly to the streets and rights-of-way.

Over the last 18 years the City Council has granted several telecommunications franchises, and many will expire soon. City staff has reviewed the terms and conditions of all of these franchises and is working with industry in an effort to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of all franchises.

The Portland Bureau of Transportation has undertaken to prepare substantial revisions to Portland City Code Title 17. Some of the planned amendments and updates may affect some of



the standardized language of future franchises and renewals. City staff recommends, in the mutual interest of the parties, an extension of the franchise to allow the development of a new franchise.

Therefore, staff recommends that the franchise should be extended to accommodate both the uncertain time that it may take to obtain final judicial rulings, and to allow the development of a uniform telecommunications franchise.
