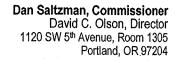

I. RECOMMENDATION.

Office for Community Technology (OCT) staff recommend, in consultation with the Commissioner-in-Charge of the OCT and the Chair of the Mt. Hood Cable Regulatory Commission (MHCRC), that Council amend the grant agreement with Portland Community Media (PCM).

II. BACKGROUND.

The MHCRC and OCT are charged with monitoring the performance of PCM under the current PCM/City contract (Grant Agreement No. 52904). Among other things, PCM has not yet submitted audited financial statements for FY 09-10 and FY 10-11 as otherwise required by the contract. Unaudited financial statements for FY09-10 and information disclosed by PCM indicate the possible application of restricted capital funds to operations, contrary to contract provisions. After consultation between and among the MHCRC, the Commissioner-in-Charge, OCT, and PCM Board and staff, all parties are in agreement that prompt, remedial action is warranted, including but not limited to amendments to the current PCM/City contract to conduct a thorough analysis of PCM financial and accounting systems, to implement necessary remedial measures, and sequester capital funds pending implementation of recommendations.

The City Attorney's office has reviewed and approved the proposed amendments. All other terms and conditions of the PCM/City contract remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
