#### II. BACKGROUND

A large void under portions of SW Harrison Street was recently discovered adjacent to existing sanitary sewer pipelines. Rehabilitation of the existing sewer (SW Harrison Street) is required in order to stabilize subsurface conditions.

The established cost is \$595,417. The level of confidence is optimal. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2011-2012 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services Cost Object, E10360.
