Mr. Dougherty joins the FPD&R board of trustees as a steward of the fund's financial health – which has a long term effect on both the City's fire and police workers as well as taxpayers.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

On June 14, 2006, the City Council referred a series of charter amendments to the voters to reform the Fire and Police Disability and Retirement (FPD&R) system. The voters overwhelmingly approved these changes, with a 81.61% yes vote on November 7, 2006. The charter amendments called for a series of changes, including the appointment of a five-person FPD&R Board of Trustees including two Citizen Trustees. Mr. Dougherty will be one of the appointed Citizen Trustees as nominated by the Mayor and approved by the Council.

The Mayor's office worked with other Council offices to find a nominee that had the appropriate professional experience called for in the charter amendments: having relevant experience in pension or disability matters. Mr. Dougherty is a pension and actuarial expert with significant experience consulting on Taft-Hartley trusts.


