The Portland Development Commission established the Gateway Urban Renewal District in 2001 to encourage development in the Gateway Regional Center Area. The plan reinforced the importance of improvements along 102nd Avenue. The Commission adopted the Gateway Urban Renewal Area Plan.

A citizen advisory committee that included representatives from local businesses, residents and service organizations developed the plan. The plan was reviewed by the public and property owners at three open houses held throughout the planning process as well as presentations to a variety of other neighborhood, community and business groups. The business community was supportive of the project.

Project is shown on the approved Transportation System Plan and implements the NE 102nd Avenue Streetscape Plan. Phase I has already been built and this IGA will continue with phase II of the original plan.
