7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Bureau of Environmental Services has added two new waste digesters at Columbia Waste Water Treatment Plant. This increase in work load surpasses existing equipment capabilities and requires two additional forklifts. N12011 will be a larger ride on style of forklift, N12012 will be a smaller walk behind forklift. The smaller forklift is required due to space limitations in some of the work areas.
