TO THE COUNCIL:

On December 15, 2010 City Council adopted Ordinance No. 184328 authorizing the use of a competitive bid for the Powell Butte Reservoir No. 2 Phase 2 Project. At that time, Council also authorized the use of a modified good faith effort process in which the awarded contractor was required to create a Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business Outreach Program Plan that must be approved and accepted in order to receive the Phase 1 (Limited) Notice to Proceed to begin construction work. The use of a modified good faith effort process was determined to be necessary to ensure maximization of minority, women and emerging small business (M/W/ESB) participation on this project. The standard Good Faith Effort Program only applies to prime contractors and it does not require good faith efforts be conducted for lower tier subcontracts. Based on the size and scope of the work for this project, it was determined there would be significant first-tier subcontracts apportioned to the piping, site civil, facilities, and landscaping work that will more than likely exclude M/W/ESB subcontractors due to the complexity and size of the work. The modified good faith effort process went one step further requiring the first-tier subcontractors to perform good faith efforts with M/W/ESB firms for any work they intend to subcontract, thus maximizing the potential for M/W/ESB participation.

On May 25, 2011, Council accepted the bid of SSC Construction (SSC), Inc. and directed Procurement Services to prepare and execute a contract. On May 26, 2011, Contract Number 30002100 was executed. As a condition of receiving the Phase 1 (Limited) Notice to Proceed to begin work, SSC was required to create a Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business Program Construction Plan (Plan) outlining the processes to be used for maximizing the participation of minority, women, and emerging small business (M/W/ESB) contractors throughout all construction phases.

As part of the Chief Procurement Officer's May 25 Report to Council, Procurement Services was directed to not only execute the contract, but to also return to Council to report on the results of the modified good faith effort process and SSC's Minority, Women and Emerging Small Business Program Construction Plan.

SSC's Plan is attached hereto as Exhibit A and will be incorporated into the contract by change order. SSC will require that all first-tier subcontractors with contracts in excess of \$100,000 comply with this Plan and accordingly will take all reasonable steps to accomplish the aspirational target of \$13 million in M/W/ESB subcontractor participation

which is 35% of the overall subcontracted amount of \$37,979,688.00 on this project. To ensure that agreed upon goals and aspirations are met, SSC has designated Mr. Mick Haggerty as the M/W/ESB Outreach Program Coordinator who will be responsible for conducting outreach and implementing the Plan throughout the duration of the project.

- 1) <u>Legislation Title</u>: Authorize a construction contract and provide payment for the Powell Butte Reservoir 2 Phase 2 Project (Ordinance)
- 2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation: To authorize the solicitation and provide payment for a contractor to complete the Powell Butte Reservoir 2, Phase 2 Project. The work on the project involves construction of a 50 million gallon buried reservoir at Powell Butte for terminal storage, approximately 5,000 linear feet of a new supply pipeline (Conduit 5), reservoir overflow piping, modifications to the outfall structure near Johnson Creek, new vaults, a maintenance and storage facility, new caretaker's house, interpretive center, park improvements, and mitigation requirements. This work will provide terminal storage, reduce vulnerabilities of the water system and is part of the program to maintain compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2).

LOW-BID SPECIAL PROJECT MINORITY, WOMEN, AND EMERGING SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAM CONSTRUCTION PLAN

I. Program Goal

The objective of SSC Construction's MWESB Program Construction Plan (Plan)on the Powell Butte Reservoir No. 2 Phase 2 Project (Project) is to maximize the utilization of MWESB Contractors to promote their economic growth and to increase competition for City of Portland construction contracts. The goal is to accomplish this objective while ensuring that the Project meets schedule, budget, and quality requirements. SSC construction will aspire to achieve the City's aspirational goal of 35% or \$13 million in MWESB subcontracting participation. SSC Construction will require full cooperation from its subcontractors in achieving the goals of this project.

To ensure that agreed upon goals and aspirations are met, and to assist in the implementation and monitoring, SSC has designated Mick Haggerty as the MWESB Outreach Program Coordinator. Mr. Haggerty will be in charge of the preparation of subcontractor procurement procedures, the MWESB Program Construction Plan, and in initiating MWESB Outreach during the pre-construction and construction services phases.

The procurement of subcontractors for the Project will consist of an open, fair and competitive subcontractor solicitation process, incorporating both SSC Construction's and the City's commitment to the utilization of MWESB's. SSC Construction and its tier 1 subcontractors will use procurement methods as described in Section V of this Plan to emphasize the utilization MWESB subcontractors.

The process, as a minimum, will include timely notification of solicitation requests; availability of and easy access to plans and specifications; identification of subcontracting work feasible for MWESB solicitation; identification of MWESB subcontractors by work categories; facilitating the interest of these subcontractors on the Project; directing prospective bidders to interested MWESB subcontractors and evaluating bid proposals for compliance with the City's solicitation requirements.

II. EEO Certification

All bidders must be currently certified as an Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Affirmative Action Employer. SSC Construction is current in its certification and will require all subcontractors to be EEO certified prior to start date and time of bid opening or it could result in delay in the awarding of a contract.

III. Identified Bidding Opportunities

SSC Construction will identify per the Exhibit 2 form attached to this Plan potential subcontract work, much of which will be used for MWESB contract opportunities in the project to meet the established MWESB target amount.

Outreach began during the prebid process and efforts to obtain more MWESB participation will continue as scopes of work become available. During such efforts, many of the tier 1 subcontractors were obtained as they were required to be listed at bid time.

IV. MWESB Awards Target

SSC Construction, through the assistance of its tier 1 subcontractors, will aspire to achieve \$13 million in MWESB subcontractor participation which is 35% of the overall subcontracted amount of \$37,979,688.00on the Project. Accordingly, SSC Construction and tier 1 subcontractors will take all reasonable steps to accomplish this target.

V. Procurement Methods

For all scopes of work that have not already been listed by SSC Construction in the bid documents for this Project, SSC and tier 1 subcontractors will procure remaining subcontractors in the construction of the Project using the following methods:

- 1. Direct Negotiations, project packages \$25,000 or less
- 2. Limited Solicitations, project packages \$100,000 or less
- 3. Informal Solicitations, project packages not greater than \$350,000
- 4. Formal Solicitations, project packages greater than \$350,000

The City and SSC Construction require that all tier 1 subcontractors with contracts in excess of \$100,000 will comply with this MWESB plan.

VI. Informal Bid Methods

1. <u>Direct Negotiation - where the Estimated Package Value (EPV) is not greater than</u> \$25,000

Project packages at this level will be negotiated directly with a subcontractor. Only one MWESB subcontractor need be solicited in this category and contract award may occur provided the bid amount is less than \$25,000 and other bid

requirements are properly met.

- Limited Solicitation where the EPV is not greater than \$100,000
 Project packages at this level will be limited to subcontractor competition. Only two MWESB subcontractors need be solicited in this category and contract award may occur provided the bid amount is less than \$100,000 and other bid requirements are properly met.
- 3. <u>Informal Solicitation where the EPV is greater than \$100,000 and less than</u> \$350,000

Project packages at this level will not be advertised; however, solicitations will target a minimum of three MWESB subcontractors indicating interest in bidding the package. If no bids are received, the project package may bid to the open market.

SSC and tier 1 subcontractors will select subcontractor(s) based on budget/price, schedule, qualifications and quality of work.

VII Formal Bid Method

- 1. <u>Formal Open Solicitation MWESB Requirements Required where the EPV is greater than \$350,000</u>
 - Subcontractor opportunities at this level will, as a minimum, be advertised in the *Daily Journal of Commerce, El Hispanic News, The Skanner, The Portland Observer, The Asian Reporter*, other MWESB publications and will be made available for posting on the City's Procurement Services web page. Posting information will be provided to the City Contract Compliance Specialist.
- 2. SSC Construction and tier 1 subcontractors will conduct pre-bid meetings for all scopes of work that have not already been listed by SSC Construction in the bid documents for this project and with an estimated value greater than \$350,000 until all scopes of work have been awarded. The purpose of the meetings is to provide clarity to bid specifications, encourage bidders to submit proposals, and to reiterate the importance of SSC Construction's commitment to and expectations for MWESB utilization. SSC Construction will coordinate meetings with the City Contract Compliance Specialist to enable attendance at all Pre-bids.
- 3. Any scopes of work having an EPV greater than \$350,000, regardless of subcontracting tier will be solicited from open market subcontractors. Subcontractors bidding on any package, division of work and/or work element having an EPV greater than \$350,000, will be required to meet the MWESB Outreach Program requirements and including the submission of all required forms. SSC Construction will require all subcontractors, either bidding or quoting work on the Project for a dollar amount greater than \$350,000 to engage MWESB requirements toward utilizing MWESB subcontractors on the work being bid or quoted. SSC Construction will deem bid proposals not meeting this requirement to be non-responsive.

VIII. Outreach Components/Utilization Strategies

- 1. SSC will conduct outreach conferences apprising MWESB contractors of the subcontracting procurement process and approach to MWESB utilization. The conferences will include information on future bidding opportunities by description of work, anticipated solicitation dates, and divisions of work identified for MWESB and local subcontractor participation. Conference attendees will be informed of the resources that will be available to them during the bidding and construction phases. Conferences may be part of regular scheduled meetings of an MWESB organization.
- 2. MWESB firms will be provided ample notification of contract opportunities. Outreach must be performed via one of the following methods: mail, email, fax or phone, through the City Procurement Services electronic resources, through minority/women trade associations and general publications. Ads will be placed in El Hispanic News, The Skanner and the Portland Observer. The notifications will inform prospective subcontractors of the type of work, bid date, availability of plans and specifications and technical assistance.
- 3. Plans and specifications will be available for review at the local plan centers, such as the Daily Journal of Commerce, OAME Plan Center, MCIP and Ford Graphics. SSC will maintain two full sets of plans and specifications for project packages for review at the OAME Plan Center by MWESB firms and via SSC Construction's ftp site, free of charge.
- 4. SSC Construction will list the names, addresses, etc. of those subcontractors having indicated interest in bidding the scope of work. SSC Construction will in turn mail an RFQ to those interested subcontractors and/or make it available for pick-up. The Request for Quotation will include a proposal number, bid date and time, bid submittal address and fax number.
- 5. All tier 1 subcontractors with contracts in excess of \$100,000 will conduct outreach as outlined above and the results of the efforts, i.e. the names, addresses, etc. of interested subcontractors will be transmitted to SSC Construction and the City Contract Compliance Specialist.
- 6. The City Contract Compliance Specialist will be provided with a copy of each project package anticipated to bid, regardless of size, scope or procurement method used, but in accordance with Section V, VI, and VII. All MWESB Forms will be submitted; Quotes, Letters of Intent to Award, and any other required forms, to the City Contract Compliance Specialist for auditing purposes.
- 7. All subcontractors that have lower tiered subcontractor(s) will be required to submit a Monthly Subcontractor Payment and Utilization Report (Form 3) however all subcontractors can expect to be paid according to accelerated payment requirements,

which is twice monthly.

X Accelerated Payment

All contracts are subject to the requirements of Volume 1 - Part B - 1.13 C-D, Progress Payments and Retained Amounts, and Mid-Month Payments, of the City of Portland Water Bureau Specification for Powell Butte Reservoir No. 2 - Phase 2, , which requires twicemonthly payment to primes and subcontractors. These provisions are mandatory on all contracts of the Project at any tier.

XII. MWESB Replacement Policy and Procedure

SSC Construction will not be permitted to substitute or replace any tier 1 MWESB subcontractors on the Project without adhering to the criteria set forth below. Prior to termination, SSC Construction will notify the City Contract Compliance Specialist in a written statement of the decision and the basis upon which the MWESB is being terminated. SSC Construction will not be permitted to terminate or substitute an MWESB subcontractor without the consent of the City's Chief Procurement Officer. The City's Chief Procurement Officer shall issue a response to the request to substitute or replace a subcontractor within 7 calendar days of receipt of notification from SSC. If a response is not issued within 7 calendar days SSC shall be allowed to substitute or replace the subcontractor without any further action.

While affording maximum opportunities for MWESB subcontractors to participate on the Project, it is imperative that the overall Project budget and schedules be maintained. Any MWESB subcontractor on the Project deemed to warrant replacement will be terminated in accordance with the relevant contract provisions as set forth in project specifications, the MWESB Bid Specifications or Plan requirements, and/or as allowed by law. The basis for termination will be one or more of the following with supportive documentation:

- 1. Inability of the company to perform the work as required, per plans and specifications
- 2. Inability to execute a subcontract with the company.
- 3. Refusal of the company to perform the work as required, as per plans and specifications
- 4. Mutual agreement of Prime Contractor and the subcontractor not to perform the work due to reasons beyond the control or influence of the Prime.
- 5 Good Cause
- 6. Failure to meet bonding requirements as required per plans and specifications

Tier 1 subcontractors will not be permitted to substitute or replace an MWESB subcontractor without notifying SSC and the City Contract Compliance Specialist. Tier 1 subcontractors are expected to follow the above guidelines and provide supportive documentation for the basis of termination.

An MWESB is considered substituted or replaced when any portion of the work identified on Form 1 of the MWESB Requirements is performed with the resources of any firm other than

that MWESB. Resources include supplying the labor, supervision, material, equipment, technical and management expertise to perform the MWESB's work.

If any subcontractor is <u>added</u> or <u>replaced</u> after the bid is submitted, the successful bidder shall make good faith efforts to contract with a MWESB for the work to be performed by that subcontractor. Documentation of these efforts is required, and must be submitted to the City Contract Compliance Specialist regardless of tier.

XIII. Documentation, Reporting and Program Evaluation

The City Contract Compliance Specialist will be provided with a copy of each project package anticipated to bid, regardless of size, scope or procurement method used. All MWESB Forms will be submitted to the City Contract Compliance Specialist for auditing purposes. See Exhibits 2-5.
