7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The City of Portland's Facilities Services Division is proceeding on behalf of Portland Fire & Rescue (PF&R) with the demolition of the existing Fire Station 21 located at 5 SE Madison and rebuilding a new seismically upgraded facility in the same location. Built in 1960, Fire Station 21 is located between the Eastbank Esplanade and the Willamette River at the base of the Hawthorne Bridge which sits on highly liquefiable soils making it extremely vulnerable to a seismic event and unsuitable for remodeling.

PF&R's day-to-day water emergency response operations must continue from Fire Station 21 while construction is underway. Water emergency response watercraft will continue to be stationed at the Madison Street Dock while temporary housing facilities will be located nearby in order to accommodate PF&R staff during the construction. Project phasing will be highly technical in nature to allow demolition and construction activities concurrent with daily emergency response operations.

The construction of Fire Station 21 will require a highly specialized and qualified contractor in order to meet the tight project schedule and technical site constraints. Work will include demolition of the existing facility, construction of a new two-story building, addition of an ADA accessible parking space, and other site improvements. The project will require specialized skills and experience in

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building construction within confined areas, project phasing, scheduling, and cost estimating. The project phasing will be highly technical in nature to allow demolition and construction activities while daily emergency response operations are ongoing. An alternative contracting method utilizing a Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) will allow PF&R to maintain a higher level of security while continuing normal emergency response operations.

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The Facilities Services Division proposes to use an alternative contracting method in order to enable the CM/GC to provide input during the design process for value engineering, constructability review and development of a construction phasing plan. Use of an alternative contracting method is more likely to minimize costs and construction impacts while ensuring continuous delivery of emergency response.

The City Council is the Local Contract Review Board with the authority to exempt certain public contracts from the competitive bidding requirements of ORS Chapter 279C.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Fire Station 21 construction budget is \$4,915,000.00 and is funded through GO bonds approved by voters in Nov 2010. The Facilities Services Division has rated this construction project as low confidence due to the complexities of the site and the requirements that the facility meet Essential Facility Standards. The construction site is on the bank of the Willamette River in inner SE Portland.

Adopt findings, authorize an exemption to the competitive bidding process to Procurement Services pursuant to ORS 279C and PCC 5.34, and authorize contracts and provide payment for construction of Fire Station 21

The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to demolish and rebuild Fire Station 21, including upgrades and improvements necessary to meet seismic standards and enhanced security requirements.
