- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 181934 adopted June 18, 2008 (SE 31st Avenue Local Improvement District, Ordinance Number 182234 adopted October 1, 2008 (NE 109th Avenue Local Improvement District, and Ordinance Number 183504 adopted February 3, 2010 (10800 and 10900 blocks of SE Center Street) directed the City Engineer to prepare plans and specifications to arrange for construction of the local improvement plans. The Ordinances further directed Procurement Services to conduct competitive procurements and prepare contracts for the local improvement plans designed by the City Engineer. The work authorized by the above Ordinances was combined into a single procurement conducted in March 2010.
 - MBE and WBE subcontractors will complete \$29,072 or 9.6% of the estimated subcontracting dollars.
- 8. **FINANCIAL IMPACT:** The estimated project cost as designed was \$1,078,349.47 (optimal level of confidence). The bid by Parker Northwest Paving Co is for the total of \$621,052.35. Funds are available in the Transportation Fund, FY 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 budgets (WBS #T00128.C42 and T00124.C42) and include a \$150,000 grant from the PDC.
- 9. **RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED:** Accept recommendation to award contract to Parker Northwest Paving Co. in the amount of \$621,052.35.
- 10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT:</u> The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary for the construction of road improvements along the following streets:

- SE 31st Avenue: 150 Feet North of Francis to 343 Feet North of Francis NE 109th Avenue: NE Marx Street to NE Deering Drive
- SE Center Street at Earl Boyles Park

Improvements shall consist of constructing, maintaining and removing temporary work zone traffic and erosion control measures; removal of structures, clearing and grubbing and earthwork operations; constructing drainage systems; constructing roadway improvements including paving. curbs and sidewalks; roadside development including seeding, planting, fencing and mailboxes; and performing additional and incidental work as called for by the specifications and plans.
