Re-Appointments

Five of seven members of the Adjustment Committee terms have expired as of June 30, 2010. The members are Dan Anderson (Public at Large), Debbie Menashe (Public at Large), Richard Larson (Engineering, Finance), Anyeley Hallova (Design), and Terry Amundson (Architect).

The contributions of these members has been outstanding and I am recommending four of them be re-appointed.

Dan, Debbie and Richard will serve second terms that will expire June 30, 2014. Anyeley has completed a partial term from March 18, 2009 through June 30, 2010 and will serve her first full term that will expire June 30, 2014. They will serve in the positions they previously held.

Terry Amundson completed a partial term and one full term in the architect position from March 16, 2004 through June 30, 2010 and is not interested in being reappointed. The architect position is vacant at this time. We will continue outreach efforts to fill the vacancy.

Adjustment Committee

The Adjustment Committee, authorized under Portland City Code 33.710.070, reviews adjustment requests to the development standards of Title 33 [Planning and Zoning Regulations]. The Adjustment Committee consists of seven members, none of whom may hold public elective office. The committee must include three persons representing the public at large, two members in either urban design, architecture, or landscape architecture, and two members experienced in either engineering, financing construction, management of buildings, or land development. The members are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. The terms shall be a maximum of four years with a maximum of two full terms.

The Adjustment Committee meets on the first and third Tuesday of each month from 9:00 – 12:00.

Current Position

Retired (as of July 1, 2005) following twenty-four years in commercial and investment banking.

My last position was Senior Vice President, Bank of America Community Development Banking; Director Bank of America Public Housing Initiative; Senior Vice President, Banc of America Securities, LLC.

My practice emphasized specialized products and programs designed to meld private debt or equity capital with public sector capital to achieve community development outcomes which neither actor was capable of providing independently. A significant portion of the work emphasized emerging markets – particularly those expressing sustainable or "smart growth" development themes. While my practice began in Oregon and the Northwest, it has been national in scope since the mid 1990s.

In my position at Bank of America I lead and participated in teams which defined and delivered new products (and the private risk capital to stand behind them) for use in the housing and community development industry. This work also involved significant path breaking transactions. Representative accomplishments include:

- Development and first use of a novel technique for financing certain federal receivables in order to capitalize larger scale reinvestment in the nation's public housing. Since the initial use of this technique in 2000, the industry has delivered in excess of \$1.5 billion of such funding to local agencies including a \$693 million financing for Puerto Rico Public Housing where I served as lead banker on the finance team.
- Development of a unique risk sharing and funding partnership between Bank of America and a consortium of life insurance companies Impact Community Capital for the purpose of creating a flow of investment opportunities for the life companies designed to reconcile their desire to take a more activist approach to community reinvestment with traditional regulatory concerns relative to asset quality. This relationship has seen the flow of over \$300 million in assets to the consortium over the past few years.
- Leading a team of lenders, investment bankers and product specialists which is providing in excess of \$100 million private risk capital and related services in support of the comprehensive revitalization of the former Columbia Villa public housing project in North Portland as New Columbia. This effort has included active (and ongoing) participation on the team of stakeholders developing the finance package for the New Columbia School. In conjunction with this effort, Bank of America has proposed to provide more than \$10 million in debt and New Market Tax Credit equity capital for a new public elementary school at the site.
- Leading a group of American contributors to the development of HART a currently active proposal for an urban regeneration tax credit for the United Kingdom. HART is proposed as a key implementing tool for the Labour government's National Strategy for Neighbourhood Renewal led by Deputy Prime Minister John Prescott. HART borrows from some aspects of US experience while expanding the range of property types and avoiding some of the baroque peculiarities of US practice. HART is now under review by the Treasury and Inland Revenue sections of UK government. For more on HART, see www.hartcredit.org.uk/index.html

From 1999 onwards, I also coordinated Bank of America's national public housing practice. While much of this work was transactional, I was also frequently appointed to represent Bank of America in various federal forums relating to housing policy generally (e.g. the Millennial Housing Commission) and specific federal programs undergoing review by the Congress or federal agencies (e.g. HUD's Negotiated Rulemaking Committee on the Public Housing Operating Fund or the House Subcommittee on Housing and Community Opportunity).

In addition to my late career focus on product development and the links between private capital suppliers and federal housing and community development programs, I spent a number of earlier years as a municipal securities investment banking generalist. This experience provided me with a broad, practical grounding in the conventions and practice patterns of industry participants relative to tax backed and enterprise revenue backed municipal securities transactions. Transactional experience includes financings for airports, water systems and electric power utilities. My earlier banking experience also included commercial real estate and governmental lending as well as staff work for a bank CFO focusing on the measurement and management of interest rate and liquidity risk.

Beyond work in the realm of business and finance, I have worked for two different California urban school districts in the area of curriculum development, as an electronics technician for the City of Eugene where I also served in several officer positions with my union local including a term as president.

I participate in local civil society. I have been actively involved in my neighborhood organization for more than a decade and have served multiple terms as a board member. I served for three years on the Board of Oregon HEAT, a multi-utility low income energy assistance provider. I am a member of the Bicycle Transportation Alliance, the Audubon Society of Portland and a sustaining supporter of the Coalition for a Livable Future.

I read omnivorously. I have traveled frequently within the US and abroad for work and to address my own interests and curiosities. My travels commonly have a comparative urban geography aspect to them. I have moderate active and passive skills in French and am currently pursuing Spanish as my second foreign language.
