This ordinance allows \$123,000 in funds appropriated in the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability's Fiscal Year (FY) 2011-12 budget, for distribution of grants to each of the three project partners: Housing Development Center (\$63,000); Community Alliance of Tenants (\$22,500); and Center for Intercultural Organizing (\$37,500). Funds will be distributed to the nonprofit agencies on a reimbursement basis.

Additional local match in the amount of \$93,600 will be provided by funds in the form of salary, benefits, and materials and services in the FY 2011-12 and 2012-2013 General Fund program budget appropriations of the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability.

5. Purpose of Agenda Item:

Authorize grant agreements to distribute Northwest Health Foundation grant to three nonprofit agencies that will work with Oregon Health Initiative and Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to establish best practices and make recommendations for design changes to retrofit and build new multifamily rental housing in East Portland.

6. History of Agenda Item/Background:

The City has been working with a coalition of partners called the Healthy Kids Healthy Communities (HKHC) consortium that includes health care providers, community representatives and others who have identified projects that could address health disparities among low-income households living in multi-family rental housing in East Portland. The consortium's findings have resulted in the City's project, "Promoting Health through Multi-family housing."
