### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

On August 6, 2008 Council approved Ordinance No. 182093 which authorized the City to execute an IGA No. C53173 to participate in the Regional Radio System Partnership with Washington County Consolidated Communications Agency, Clackamas 800 Radio Group and the Clark Regional Emergency Services Agency. The Partnership was created as an intergovernmental entity to provide governance for the region's Replacement Radio System and Upgrade project.

IGA No. C53173 dictates that the Partnership shall be self-sufficient in its operation and obtain operation and maintenance funding from the Partners. Operating costs shall be allocated among the Partners and budgeted in amounts required for operation and minor equipment replacement. Ordinance No. 182093 did not allocate funds to pay the City's portion of expenses as the Partnership had not been formed yet; therefore, funding forecasts could not be accurately completed.

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funding not to exceed \$20,000 per year will be provided by the Bureau of Technology Services.

### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve amending Ordinance No. 182093 to allow the City to pay up to \$20,000 per year for City's portion of the operating expenses related to the Regional Radio System Partnership.
