#### I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize contract with Brown and Caldwell for the Condition Assessment of Large Diameter Sewers Project.

### II. BACKGROUND

BES is implementing a capacity management operations and maintenance program (CMOM) as part of the latest National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the Columbia Boulevard Wastewater Treatment Plant. An element of this program is the inspection and condition assessment of the collection system. Accurate, current information on the condition of the larger sewers in the City's collection system will be critical as these are vital elements of the collection system and, due to their size, locations and flow characteristics may pose significant challenges to maintain and rehabilitate if necessary.

In addition to preventative maintenance, this project will support ongoing capital improvement projects within BES. BES has identified specific large diameter sewers that are known to require rehabilitation and others (due to their proximity to defective sewers) that are likely to require rehabilitation. The condition assessment information and engineering recommendations completed as part of this project will be used as a basis to develop the final design scope and select an appropriate rehabilitation methodology for these projects.

BES has approximately 600,000 lineal feet of sewer larger than 36 inches. Materials vary with approximately 85 percent concrete, 10 percent brick or brick with stone invert and 5 percent with various other materials. Construction methods include tunneling, open excavation monolithic formed sewers, open excavation pre-cast materials and various lining methods. The large diameter sewers are also of varying shapes including circular, egg-shaped, horseshoe, catenary. In some instances, the shape of the sewer negatively impacts the ability to perform condition assessment.

Most of the City's large diameter sewers were inspected in the 1990's using CCTV (closed-circuit television) inspection, sonar or a combination of these two methodologies. There has been some additional CCTV inspection performed more recently. These critical sewers continue to age and information available from CCTV inspection alone is somewhat limited.

BES does not have the in-house resources to perform specialty inspections that will be needed in some of the sewers, including but not limited to sonar imaging and laser profiling in conjunction with CCTV inspection. For some of the sewers, external conditions may also need to be assessed for potential void detection. In addition, BES does not have adequate resources to perform evaluation of the results of the inspections that would include the estimate of remaining useful life and rehabilitation recommendations.
