Lease and License Agreements: The Administrator may approve, accept, and amend on behalf of the City Council, leases, licenses, permits, or other similar agreements for use by others of Water Bureau property upon such terms and conditions as the Administrator deems to be in the best interest of the City and when approved as to form by the City Attorney.

ORDINANCE No.

Clarify duties and responsibilities of the Water Bureau Administrator and ratify existing lease agreements (Ordinance; amend Code, Chapter 21.12)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Portland Water Bureau owns and manages facilities used to supply water to the City. The Water Bureau has entered into lease or license agreements when doing so provides a benefit to the City.
- 2. City Charter Chapter 11 Special Services, Article 1 Water Works, Section 11-102 Administration states the Council may rent or lease equipment or facilities to or from others, and may sell or otherwise dispose of City property, facilities, supplies or equipment, as it finds convenient.
- 3. Ordinance No. 182053, passed by the Council on July 16, 2008, added City Code 21.12.330 (A) which authorizes the Chief Engineer to approve, accept and amend on behalf of the City Council easements, permits, rights-of-way, former rights-of-way and related documents needed for the construction and management of the water system of the City of Portland.
- 4. Ordinance No. 182053 also added City Code 21.12.330 (B) which authorizes the Chief Engineer and the Administrator to approve, accept and amend on behalf of the City Council contracts and related documents for real property interests, excluding easements, needed for the construction and management of the water system of the City of Portland.
- 5. Additional language is needed to clarify City Code 21.12.330 and identify the responsibilities and authority of the Water Bureau Administrator to include signing authority for non-water purposes and as a lessor.
- 6. The Water Bureau has existing lease agreements as described in Exhibit B which need to be ratified by City Council concurrent with the passage of this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. Amend City Code Title 21, Chapter 21.12 Water Services as set forth in Exhibit A of this Ordinance to clarify the responsibilities and authority of the Water Bureau Administrator to approve, accept, and amend on behalf of the City Council, leases, licenses, permits, or other similar agreements for use by others of Water Bureau property upon such terms and conditions as the Administrator deems to be in the best interest of the City and when approved as to form by the City Attorney.

- b. The Water Bureau will report on all leases in accordance with the requirements of the Accounting Division of the Bureau of Financial Services of the Office of Management and Finance.
- c. Prior to entering into any lease or other arrangement allowing the placement of private telecommunications equipment on Water Bureau facilities, the Water Bureau shall consult with the Office for Community Technology.

d. The lease agreements as described in Exhibit B are ratified by the City Council upon passage of this Ordinance.
