SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and labor to remove, rehabilitate, reinstall and test seven submersible well pumps and motors, provide new motor cables, provide gaskets and other pipe accessories, bail and inspect wells, and complete various tests. The motors range from 150 to 600 horsepower. The pump settings range from about 100 to 325 feet.
