This action is related to an ongoing cooperative relationship between the Multnomah County District Attorney's (MCDA) Office and the Portland Police Bureau. The practice allows the MCDA to more effectively prosecute cases which the Police Bureau would otherwise bring to it in the normal course of operations. As part of this agreement, the County reimburses the Police Bureau the equivalent of 7.3 hours of overtime per pay period for each of the officers assigned to the District Attorney's office as investigators. For this reason it is not deemed to be controversial, and the bureau sought no particular public input on the practice.
