Portland Community Media provides media and broadband technology training, tools and distribution platforms to diverse communities throughout the City of Portland to engage broad participation in civic and cultural life and to provide cable programming of, by and for the community over local public and governmental access cable channels.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The MHCRC conducted a community needs ascertainment in 2010 to assess local communications technology and infrastructure needs. One of the Commission's goals for its community needs ascertainment study was to reflect the broad and diverse voices of our communities. In order to address inclusion, the Commission deployed a multitude of data collection methods, including a scientific phone poll; online surveys; focus group discussions and interviews. ## I. RECOMMENDATION.

The Mt. Hood Cable Regulatory Commission (MHCRC) recommends, in consultation with the Office for Community Technology (OCT) staff and the Commissioner-in-Charge of the OCT, that Council approve a five-year grant agreement with Portland Community Media (PCM) to support PCM's community media and technology training, content production and local distribution services to the City and the community at-large.

#### II. BACKGROUND.

The MHCRC and OCT are proud to bring this proposed agreement forward for consideration by the City Council. The contract provides for the continuation of core services provided by PCM to the community and the City, while requiring PCM to focus resources on keeping pace with changing content production methods and new ways in which people are using technology to communicate.

The MHCRC and OCT are charged with monitoring the performance of PCM under the current PCM/City contract (Grant Agreement No. 52904).

## III. FINANCIAL IMPACT.

Under the contract funding methodology, PCM's funding for FY2012-13 would be \$878,194. Staff believes the proposed contract language protects the City's interests in times of financial duress. The proposed language retains a clause about the City's ability to reduce funding under extraordinary circumstances with commensurate PCM service level reductions.

The City Attorney's office has reviewed and approved the proposed grant agreement.
