This partnership also provides linkage to social service resources and uses the Raintree database to identify and follow up with individuals who are generating frequent police contact due to a mental health or emotional crisis. The City wishes to amend Contract No. 30002518 by extending the term of the agreement through June 30, 2013 and increase compensation in an amount not to exceed \$105,894.
