a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

As part of a broad public involvement approach in this phase of the West Hayden Island project, an Advisory Committee continues to advise the City with the implementation of Council Resolution No. 36805 and the various requested studies related to decisions on the future of West Hayden Island. This ordinance is to amend the funding and time period of the contract with a project facilitator, who is charged with facilitating the Project Advisory Committee.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

As part of the City's broader Public Involvement Plan an Advisory Committee was formed for West Hayden Island. The Advisory Committee is made up of 12 members with representation from the following groups/organizations: Oregon Fish and Wildlife, Port of Portland, Metro, Hayden Island Neighborhood groups (2 representatives), Oregon Association of Minority Contractors, Planning and Sustainability Commission, Audubon Society, Lower Columbia River Estuary Partnership, Portland Parks and Recreation, NW Oregon Labor Council and Capacity Commercial Group. The public involvement plan also includes the formation of technical panels for the review of studies that are being done per Council Resolution No. 3680. Several State and Federal regulatory agencies have been, and will continue to be involved as part of the technical review panels. This amendment adds funding and extends the period of the contract to enable the project facilitator, who is charged with facilitating Advisory Committee meetings, subcommittee meetings and technical panel discussions, to conduct a successful and transparent process.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

This Council item requests authorization of a fourth amendment to the contract with the Institute of Conflict Management, Inc. to provide additional funding and extend facilitation support service for the West Hayden Island Plan. The project Advisory Committee, as well as all individuals who have been involved with the project facilitator, continue to support his work to date on all project activities.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

BPS created and is implementing the public involvement plan for the project which was produced in November 2010, as directed by Council Resolution No. 36805.

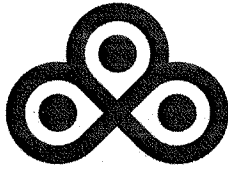
10) Is any future public involvement anticipated or necessary for this Council item? Please describe why or why not.

5. **Purpose of Agenda Item:** To accept Amendment 4 to add funding to the Institute for Conflict Management's contract for facilitation services in the amount of \$25,000 (for a total of \$128,050).

6. **History of Agenda Item/Background:**

On July 29, 2010, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 36805 to direct the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to prepare a legislative proposal for West Hayden Island including, an area plan and related Comprehensive Plan and Zoning changes necessary to annex West Hayden Island into the city. The city engaged the services of the Institute for Conflict Management, Inc., to provide facilitation services to staff the Advisory Committee on the West Hayden Island planning project. The initial contract for \$22,000 was effective on November 12, 2010 and has been amended three previous times for additional services and funding.

7. **Legal Issues:** None related to contract process.



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8. What individuals or groups are or would be supportive or opposed to this action?

The project Advisory Committee, as well as all individuals who have been involved with the consultant have been supportive of the consultant's work to date on all project activities.

9. How does this relate to current City policies? The facilitation done by the consultant is in accordance with the process approved through Resolution No 36805 to direct BPS to develop a legislative proposal for annexation of West Hayden Island to the City with the intent to protect at least 500 acres as open space, and identify no more than 300 acres for future deep water marine terminal development. The Advisory Committee's charge is to serve in an advisory capacity on the West Hayden Island project.
