7. **BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS**

Introduction and History – Attached is an ordinance for first reading by the City Council on July 25, 2012. The Ordinance authorizes adding the Oregon 529 College Savings Plan to the list of organizations eligible to use the City employee payroll deduction system.
