There are no new community impacts anticipated as a result of this contract extension.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved? As required by federal regulations, a Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) describing the overall framework for public involvement was developed and adopted with the 2011-2016 Consolidated Plan.

A series of hearing and public meetings were held regarding the development of the Plan, in all areas of the city to ensure access to a broad range of community members. Translation services were provided when requested. All hearings locations were accessible to persons with disabilities. All documents were posted on the Portland Housing Bureau website. One of the hearings was held concurrent with a Coordinating Committee to End Homelessness (CCEH) meeting. This group meets monthly and is comprised of service providers, government representatives, advocates and currently and formerly homeless persons, including representatives of Dignity Village.

The PHB contract manager has visited Dignity Village on numerous occasions over the past year, to meet with both Board members and residents. The Board and residents of Dignity Village were involved in this effort, as were staff from a number of City bureaus. They provided input and reviewed new contract terms.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The development and modification of the contract between the City and the Dignity Village non-profit is a collaborative process involving several City bureaus and Dignity Village residents and Board members. The City lead is Sally Erickson, Ending Homelessness Program Manager at the Portland Housing Bureau and manager of this contract.
