This resolution relates to pending legal actions associated with the City's potential Superfund liability for natural resource restoration. However, the resolution does state that the City will implement Superfund restoration in partnership with the Natural Resources Trustees Council. The Trustee Council consists of representatives of eight Trustees:

- National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, acting on behalf of U.S. Department of Commerce
- U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, acting on behalf of U.S. Department of the Interior
- Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, acting on behalf of State of Oregon
- Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde Community of Oregon
- Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians
- Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation
- Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon

The Trustees Council recently completed a programmatic Environmental Impact Statement for restoration, a process which included all the projects contemplated by the City.
