STP funds from ODOT for this project will be \$4,013,000, of this amount, the City will receive a grant from ODOT in the amount of \$4,005,500 and ODOT will directly perform work estimated to cost \$7,500. Additionally, a local match of 10.27% is required. The match of \$459,306 will come from two budgeted accounts for sidewalk infill and neighborhood greenway and funded via Gas Tax.
