#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The existing flow meters on the conduits at Headworks are 60 to 100 years old, do not provide precise measurements, and require frequent maintenance. Accurate flow measurement is a critical component in calculating the chlorine feed rate for disinfection and the chlorine contact time to meet regulatory requirements. New meters and control valves are required to provide reliable and accurate flow measurements. The new meters and control valves will improve operations and improve accuracy of the chlorine feed and disinfection calculations for regulatory compliance. This project will construct six new flow meters, three new control valves and associated piping, electrical and instrumentation on the water conduits at Headworks. Notice to Proceed is anticipated in July 2013 with construction to be complete by June 2014.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The current estimated cost for the work under the awarded contract is \$2,120,000. Funding for this contract action will be requested in the FY 2013-14 Budget. All expenditures for this contract are anticipated to occur in FY 2013-14.

Authorize a solicitation for bid and a contract for the construction components of the Headworks Flow Meters Project.
