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Parks will pay \$950,000 plus closing costs (up to \$5,000) to acquire this property. The property was appraised in November 2012 at \$910,000. The higher than market value price is justified due to its prominent aspect, unique and historic nature of the property, and long standing, documented desire of the City to bring the property into public ownership. Additionally, at closing, Parks will reimburse TPL for all costs of demolishing the house and any other improvements on the property. This cost is not expected to exceed \$75,000 and will be paid with SDC funds. An additional \$10,000 in stabilization costs will be paid for from SDC funds. O&M is estimated at \$1,875 per year at this time. Once the property is developed, the costs will increase and a new O&M request will be made.
