9. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The Police Bureau has been an active member of the Multnomah County Family Violence Coordinating Council since 1999, with participating members active in the current version of the Domestic Violence Enhanced Response Team (DVERT) since its creation in 2006. The DVERT goals are to identify and effectively respond to high risk offenders and to increase the safety and well-being of victims.

In 2012, partner agencies collaborated on the Department of Justice (DOJ) Office on Violence Against Women (OVAW) Grants to Encourage Arrest Policies and Enforcement of Protection Orders (GTEAP) grant application. The 2012 DOJ OVAW GTEAP grant was awarded to Multnomah County in late 2012. The grant will reimburse the City of Portland \$55,942 for the DVERT sergeant during the 21-month grant period, which is January 1, 2013, through September 30, 2014. The Intergovernmental Agreement authorization agreement for the grant award is a separate Council item.

There are no legal or controversial issues. There are no links to current City policies. Multiple Multnomah County departments participate in the DVERT program. There are no program volunteers.
